



Package Contents




 Second, if you have a headset, connect to the phone base. <u>NOTE</u>: Headsets are optional.







 <u>OPTIONAL</u>: Connect the USB devices. <u>NOTE</u>: The USB port can also be used to connect other USB Devices, such as EXP50 or a USB Headset.



4. Finally, connect the network and power connections. There are two options, your Administrator will advise you which ones to use. <u>NOTE</u>: The IP Phone should only be used with the original Yealink Power Adapter (5)((2A) from

Adapter (5V/2A) from your package. Use of a third-party power adapter may cause damage to the phone. If connecting to a PC to your IP Phone, use the Ethernet Cable provided in your equipment package. If inline power (PoE) is provided, no power adapter is needed. Make sure the hub/switch is PoE compliant.





5. Upon connection, the phone will automatically begin the initialization process. After start-up, the phone is ready for use.

Using Basic Call Functions

Placing A Call

USING THE HANDSET

- 1. Pick up the handset
- 2. Enter the number and then press Send

USING THE SPEAKERPHONE

- 1. With the handset on the hook, press
- 2. Enter the number and then press Send

USING THE HEADSET

- 1. With the headset connected, place the headset on your head and press (1) to activate headset mode
- 2. Enter the number and then press Send

<u>NOTE</u>: During a call, users can alternate between the Headset or hands-free and Speakerphone by pressing **Reject**, then pressing the **Headset** button, **Speakerphone** button or by picking up the **Handset**. To use Handset mode, users must have a Yealink or compatible headset.

Answering A Call

USING THE HANDSET

1. Pick up the handset

USING THE SPEAKERPHONE



USING THE HEADSET

1. Press 💿

<u>NOTE</u>: Users can reject a call by pressing the **Reject** soft key with red background.

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Ending a Call

USING THE HANDSET

1. Hang up the handset or press the End Call soft key

USING THE SPEAKERPHONE

1. Press or **End Call** soft key

USING THE HEADSET

1. Press the End Call soft key

Redialing a Call

Press to enter the Placed Calls list, press or to select the desired entry, and then press or Send
Press twice when the phone is idle to dial out the last dialed number

Muting and Un-Muting A Call

- 1. Press 🕼 to mute the microphone during a call
- 2. Press again to un-mute the call

Holding and Resuming A Call

TO PUT A CALL ON HOLD

1. Press or **Hold** during an active call

TO RESUME A CALL, DO ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. If there is only one call on hold, press or **Resume**
- 2. If more than one call is on hold, press Or Oto select the desired call and then press or **Resume**



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Users can transfer a call in one of the following ways:

PERFORMING A BLIND TRANSFER

- 1. Press or **Transfer** during an active call to place the call on hold
- 2. Then enter the number you want to transfer to
- 3. Press again or **B Transfer**

PERFORMING A SEMI-ATTENDED TRANSFER

- 1. Press or **Transfer** during an active call to place the call on hold
- 2. Then enter the number you want to transfer to, and press Send
- 3. Press again or **Transfer** when you hear the ring-back tone

PERFORMING AN ATTENDED TRANSFER

- 1. Press or **Transfer** during an active call to place the call on hold
- 2. Then enter the number you want to transfer to, and press Send
- 3. Press again or **Transfe**r when the second party answers the call

Forwarding A Call

- 1. Navigate to Menu, select Features and then Call Forward
- 2. Select forward type:
 - <u>Always Forward</u> Incoming calls are forwarded unconditionally
 - <u>Busy Forward</u> Incoming calls are forwarded if the users' line is busy
 - <u>No Answer Forward</u> Incoming calls are forwarded after a period if the call is unanswered
- 3. Enter the number you want to forward to.
 - For **No Answer Forward**, press or to select the desired ring time to wait before forwarding the **After Ring Time** field.
- 4. Press Save



Initiating A Conference Call

- 1. Press **Conference** during an active call to place the call on hold
- 2. Enter the number of the second party, then press Send
- 3. Press Conference again when the second party answers the call to connect all parties to the call
- 4. Press End Call to disconnect all parties.

<u>NOTE</u>: You can split the conference call back into two individual calls by pressing the **Split** softkey.

Configuring and Using Speed Dial

TO CONFIGURE A SPEED DIAL KEY

- 1. Navigate to Menu, select Features and then Dsskey
- 2. Select the desired DSS key and then press Enter
- 3. Select **SpeedDial** from the **Type** field, select the desired line from the **Account ID** field, enter a label in the **Label** field and finally enter the number in the **Value** field
- 4. Press Save

USING THE SPEED DIAL KEY

1. Press the speed dial key to dial out the present number

Listening to Voice Mails

The message waiting indicator (looks like a letter) will appear on the idel screen and indicates that one or more voicemail messages are waiting at the message center. The power indicator LED, at the top of the screen, slowly flashes red.

- 1. Press or Connect
- 2. Follow the voice prompts to listen to your voicemail messages

Customizing Your Phone

Managing Call History

- 1. Press **History**, then \bigcirc or \bigcirc to select an entry from the list
- 2. Do the following:
 - Press Send to call the entry
 - Press **Delete** to delete the entry from the list
 - Press **Option** and choose from the following:
 - Select **Detail** to view detailed information about the entry
 - o Select Add to Contacts to add the entry to the local directory
 - o Select Add to Blacklist to add the entry to the blacklist
 - Select **Delete All** to delete entries from the list

Managing Contact Directory

Adding a Contact

- 1. Press Directory, and then select All Contacts and press Add to add a contact
- 2. Enter a unique contact name in the **Name** field and contact numbers in corresponding fields
- 3. Press Save

EDITING A CONTACT

- 1. Press Directory, and then select All Contacts
- 2. Press \bigcirc or \bigcirc to select an entry from the list, press **Option** and then select **Delete**
- 3. Press **OK** when the LCD screen prompts "Delete selected item?"

Adjusting the Volume

Press to adjust the volume up or down.

Setting Ring Tones

- 1. Navigate to Menu, next Basic, then Sound and finally Ring
- 2. Press \odot or \odot to select **Common** or the desired account and then press **Enter**
- 3. Press \odot or \odot to select the desired ring tone
- 4. Press Save

Operating Ambient Temperatures

- <u>Operating Temperature</u>: +32 to 104°F (0 to 40°C)
- <u>Relative Humidity</u>: 5% to 90% noncondensing
- <u>Storage Temperature</u>: -22 to +160°F (-30° to +70°C)

Environmental Requirements

- Place the device at a well-ventilated place. Do not expose the device under direct sunlight.
- Keep the device dry and free of dusts.
- Do not place the device on or near any inflammable or fire-vulnerable object, such as rubber-made materials.
- Keep the device away from any heat source or bare fire, such as a candle or an electric heater.

Cleaning Requirements

- Before cleaning the device, disconnect it from the power supply.

Operating Requirements

- Do not let a child operate the device without guidance.
